### May Evergreen Camera Club Program presented by Joseph Roybal

Fine art landscape photographer, Joseph Roybal, spoke at the general program meeting last Wednesday. His pre-

sentation about taking the time to plan a photographic itinerary before setting out on a trip where you plan to do a lot of photography. He outlined his planning workflow that maximizes time in the field to photograph rather than having to do a lot of scouting out of locations, times for

the best photos, and roads getting in to the best places. Reminiscent of scouting a route for hiking, or backpacking, he uses a number of online and technical resources to do his planning.

Before heading out, Joseph uses Google Earth Pro to find locations and routes. He searches out dates, photo subjects and locations by checking various online sites where photos were taken in a given area. He books all rooms, etc. early, and can pay later with sites like booking.com. Then he downloads maps to his smart phone and navigates by the pins he has set earlier.
