We want to give you an update regarding the PSA Photo Festival as our plans relate to the pandemic that was announced on March 11, 2020.

Obviously, we care a great deal about the health and safety of every member, especially when we come together in a group setting in Colorado Springs later this year. No one is treating the virus lightly, but we want to assure you that we currently plan to hold the Photo Festival in Colorado Springs. Many procedures are underway to curtail and treat this global virus, and many activities have been cancelled, but many others are still in place. This is especially the case for those events and activities occurring in the last 3-4 months of the year.

The PSA Photo Festival is not until late September, so we want you to register as usual beginning April 1, 2020. You will be able to register without making a payment at time of registration. (click link below for instructions.)

Four Types of PSA Memberships

- 1. **Individual** Membership benefits for an individual member.
- 2. **Member Club** Localized photography clubs whose members are not required to be Individual PSA members. The PSA benefits are therefore structured for the Club as an organization.
- 3. **Council** Group of PSA Member Clubs, usually within close geographic proximity. A Council typically meets less frequently than a local club and is a way to connect an expanded community of photographers.
- 4. **Chapter** Local chartered branches of the Society. Members of a Chapter must be individual PSA members. The Chapter functions as a community of photographers that may reach out to a larger geographical area while holding one to four regionally coordinated meetings or events per year.

WILDLIFE & HABITAT ROUNDTABLE

Colorado Outdoor Photography & The Colorado Parks and Wildlife Agency (CPW)



PSA member, **Bob Dean**, currently represents Colorado's photographic community through participation in *The Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW)* roundtable discussions. Members from our community of photographers are needed to help drive the discussions.

Rapid growth is changing the landscape of Colorado and the voices for our public lands will naturally evolve with this change. The question remains, whose voice will be heard? The CPW roundtable discussions provide an opportunity to influence future management of Colorado's iconic locations and access to recreation.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) gathers input from Colorado residents in the form of roundtable discussions. Participants in the discussions include representatives from several recreational interests, including nature photographers. Anyone who enjoys Colorado's public lands and the recreation offered is a stakeholder in the future of public land use.

The CPW roundtable objective is to reach a comfortable balance, this balance cannot be achieved without first understanding that to preserve all Colorado offers is to know our neighbors and engage in open, respectful dialog. Nature photographers are one example of those who join in the *Wildlife* and Habitat Roundtable while the Sportsperson's Roundtable is steered by anglers and hunters. Photographers generally collaborate with other stakeholders that share a 'non-consumptive' relationship to land use (e.g., bird watchers).

If you are a photographer in Colorado that gravitates toward our public lands for your subjects, then your voice and involvement could very well have an impact in the management and future of our state's natural heritage and its recreational opportunities. Your voice, for instance, may influence the direction of taxpayer money appropriations for management of wildlife; be that hunting, fishing, bird watching, predator control, etc.

Note from Bob Dean:

Colorado PSA members: Please consider engaging with the CPW Wildlife and Habitat Roundtable group. It can be as simple as joining an email list I will manage. Once on the list you will receive quarterly messages about the upcoming meeting with tentative agenda items. I'd ask that these items be reviewed, and comments or additions made. Also, it would be great if someone would volunteer to act as an alternate for me. The CPW director, Dan Prenzlow, has asked that each organization have a representative and an alternate.

Example 2



The next section is Photo Tours


When you click on the button to choose that tour it will give you the same option to click on the Deposit button so that you are not charged.

You will need to do this for each tour, make sure to click the deposit button for each tour, this will save you a spot on that tour.



The next section is for Chapter Breakfast and all Division Meals.

You will be able to select as many as you want and the same thing will apply, click on the deposit button so that there is no current charge.


The next section is Honors Banquet selections and the same thing will apply, once you make your choice click on the deposit button.

It will take you to the end page. In this example I did not click on one of the deposit buttons, If missed here it what it will look like.


Total \$39.00 now, \$565.00 due on July 1, this tells me I forgot to click on one of the deposits for something I selected, otherwise it would say Total \$565.00 on July 1.

At this time you will be able to use previous page to go back and select \$0.00 amount for your selection to correct date.

Once you are satisfied, you can click save registrant.



This now takes you to the check out screen and will show you \$0.00 due at this time. You will, however, have to enter in your payment information for it to be saved to the system but it will not be billed at this time.
